Bessie learned French so she could take flying lessons in France where there was less prejudice. She earned her pilot's license in 1921—two years before Amelia Earhart. Bessie performed daring stunts at major U.S. airshows, although her career lasted only five years before she died in a 1926 flying accident. Just a few years ago, Bessie Coleman was honored with a postage stamp.
